

REGULAR MEETING OF MAYOR AND COUNCIL: September 13, 2016

The City Council of Union Point met in regular session on Tuesday, September 13, 2016, at 6:00 P.M., in the Four-Room School Building, at 211 Veazey Street, with Mayor Heidbrider presiding. The members present were Linda Barrington, Bill Callaway, Sylvester Johnson, Nancy Lowry and Janie Watts.

Mayor Heidbrider called the meeting to order and opened the meeting with a prayer. Then everyone stood for the pledge of allegiance to the flag.

Council reviewed the minutes of the August 09, 2016 regular council meeting. Mayor Heidbrider asked for a motion to approve the minutes. Ms. Lowery made a motion to approve the minutes. Seconded by Mr. Callaway. The motion passed unanimously.

Council reviewed the executive session minutes for the August 09, 2016 regular council meeting. Mayor Heidbrider asked for a motion to approve the executive session minutes. Mr. Callaway made a motion to approve the executive session minutes. Seconded by Ms. Watts. The motion passed unanimously.

Gary Hedrick discussed the Firefly Trail benefits, history, application process, funding, and details of the work to be completed. Wayne Jackson asked for the council to vote to approve applying for the grant to extend the Firefly Trail in Union Point. Mr. Johnson made a motion to accept the recommendation. Seconded by Ms. Watts. The motion passed unanimously.

City Attorney Joe Reitman stated that there should be a court date scheduled at the end of October to settle the mediation with Greene County regarding service delivery strategy of service provided.

Clerk/Treasurer Wayne Jackson gave the City Clerk's Report.

The Council went through their Committee Reports. The Cemetery Committee reported that the greenery discussed at a previous meeting is available and ready to order. The Union Point Elementary School committee reported that everything is going well at the school. The Economic Development Committee stated that everyone should be spotlighting the new businesses in town. Wayne Jackson wanted to make the council aware of the Rehabilitation Center that would like to operate in the location of the old Porterdale Pawn building.
